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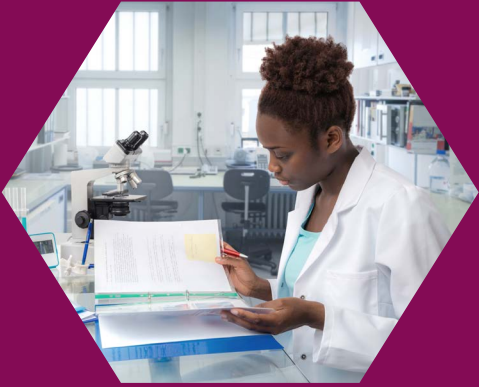

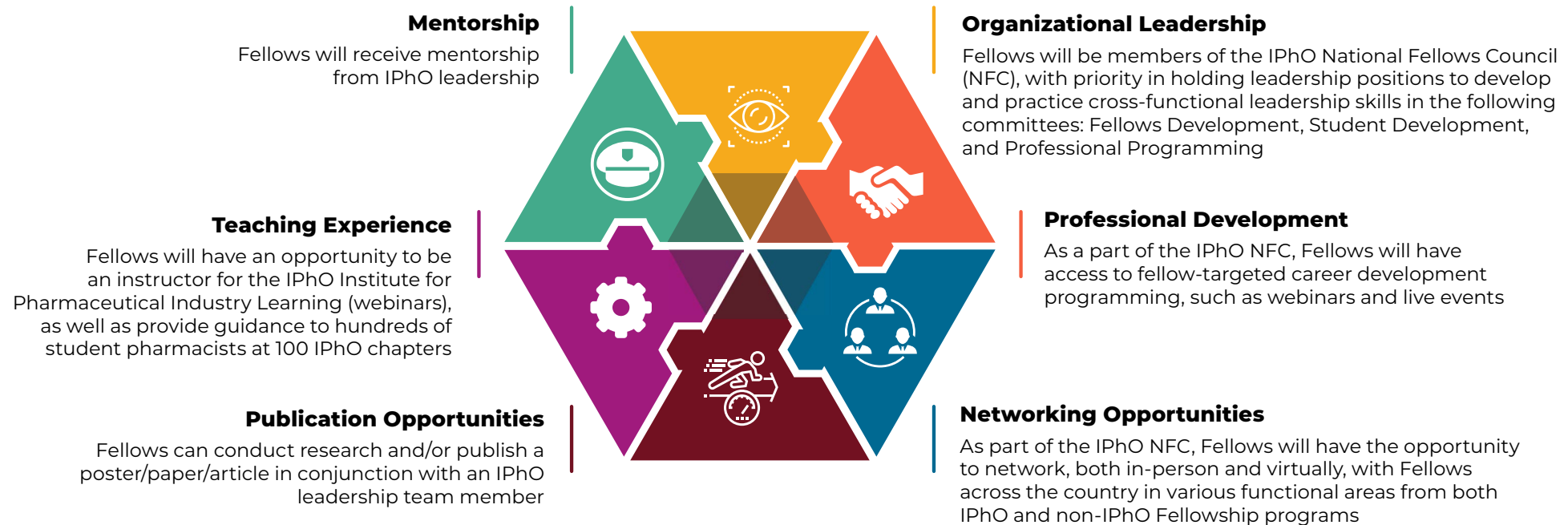

Application Timeline

- Video interviews will be offered to eligible candidates on a rolling basis after a CV, letter of intent, and writing sample are received
- Competitive candidates will be asked to complete a writing test
- Virtual final round interviews will be held in November and December on a rolling basis, during which candidates will be asked to deliver a presentation to staff

John Watson, PhD

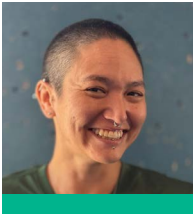

Dr. John Watson is a senior medical writer with experience in the development and publication of primary and secondary peer-reviewed articles; abstracts, posters, and slides for major medical congresses; and other written materials such as global scientific platforms and lexicons, advisory board and steering committee reports, MSL slide decks, and medical briefs. John completed his postdoctoral studies at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, CA, where he identified novel G-protein heterotrimeric protein subunits and characterized their signaling properties, and developed G-protein subunit-specific polyclonal antibodies for Western blot and tissue-binding experiments. He received his PhD from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Public Health, for research on molecular mechanisms in CYP1A1-mediated chemical carcinogenesis. Prior to becoming a medical writer, John was a senior research investigator in the Lead Discovery and High-Throughput Screening group at Bristol-Myers Squibb, Wallingford, CT, where he specialized in ligand binding and signal transduction assays for G-protein-coupled receptors as drug targets for neuroscience, immunology, and oncology, as well as for metabolic and cardiovascular diseases. He also prepared preclinical study reports to support NDA submissions.

Mari Willeman, PhD



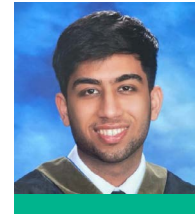
